Recession or not, we must continue to live our lives and hope that our one life makes a positive impact on someone else. With any ongoing project, expenses will go in one direction while revenue go in another. Either way, the twain will meet somewhere in the middle and the positive effects will be made. With contributions totaling \$8875 and expenses over \$10,000, we were still able to provide our community with library, computer, internet, and community services. We were blessed to provide the children with their educational “goodie bags”, provide scholarships for students from the community, a semblance of summer camp, books and computers to local libraries and schools, and upgrade our library equipment. With a building filled with books, access is upgraded yearly because you have been so dedicated to the cause of simply stretching a little further and touching a little rural library on a red dirt path in the sun. *For this, I continue to thank you!*
